

HELSEBIBLIOTEKET – The Norwegian Electronic Health Library

The Norwegian Electronic Health Library provides health care professionals and students with free access to point-of-care tools, guidelines, systematic reviews, scientific journals, and a wide variety of other full-text resources. A significant proportion of the content is available to the public.

Point-of-care tools

The collection includes widely recognized point-of-care tools such as:

- BMJ Best Practice
- UpToDate
- Micromedex

Medical journals

Helsebiblioteket.no provides access to approximately 3000 medical and health journals, including:

- New England Journal of Medicine (NEJM)
- BMJ (partially available)

Databases

Healthcare professionals and students can log in to get free access to bibliographic databases such as:

- MEDLINE
- PsycINFO
- The Cochrane Library
- Guidelines International Network (G-I-N)
- CINAHL

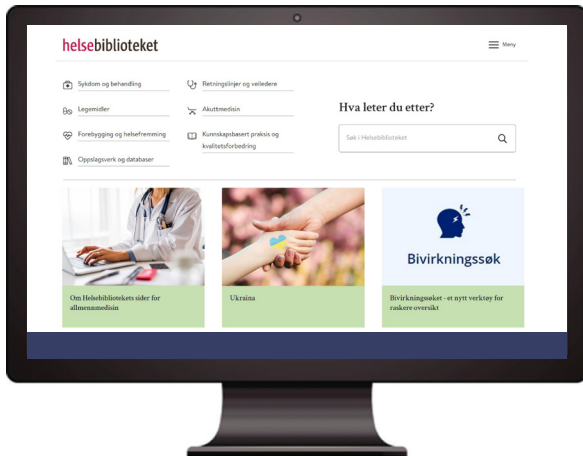
Special collections

The Library contains special collections for mental health, public health, toxicology, nursing, family medicine, and prison health. We also offer a collection of clinical guidelines and procedures, a large number of rating scales, patient information leaflets and more.

Search engine

The Library integrates information sources in Norwegian and English with a bilingual search engine. This means that the users can search in many different sources concurrently and use Norwegian search terms even if the content is in English.





About us

The Norwegian Electronic Health Library is a publicly funded online knowledge service for health care professionals and students in Norway, available through the website www.helsebiblioteket.no.

The Library was officially launched in 2006, is funded through Norway's National Budget and is hosted by the Norwegian Institute of Public Health.

Mobile tools

The Norwegian Electronic Health Library provides free access to several tools for smartphones and other handheld devices, including:

- Legemiddelutregning: app for drug dosage calculations, developed in collaboration with the Norwegian Medicines Agency
- Offline app version of the Norwegian emergency medicine handbook "Legevakthåndboken"
- Pediatri: app based on two clinical guidelines from the pediatric branch of the Norwegian Medical Association
- Offline app version of the point-of-care tool BMJ Best Practice
- A collection of apps based on the drug database Micromedex



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
